Bangladesh exporters should seize the opportunity of duty free access to Australia

Bangladesh business community should take advantage of the duty free entry of products from LDCs to Australia. This was urged by Bangladesh High Commissioner to Australia M. Humayun Kabir during the opening of the Bangladesh Pavilion at the Asia on Show in Sydney on 17 May 2007. He also hoped that by attending such kind of trade Shows, Bangladeshi firms could make god business contacts with local business community with their good quality and cost competitive products. Another company, Ashirbad Plus, run by a female entrepreneur Ms. Aysha Rahman Shilpi was also happy to receive some prospective buyers. She said yesterday, "I got order for one of my products, quilt and I am optimistic that I will get more for other items in next three days of the Show".
