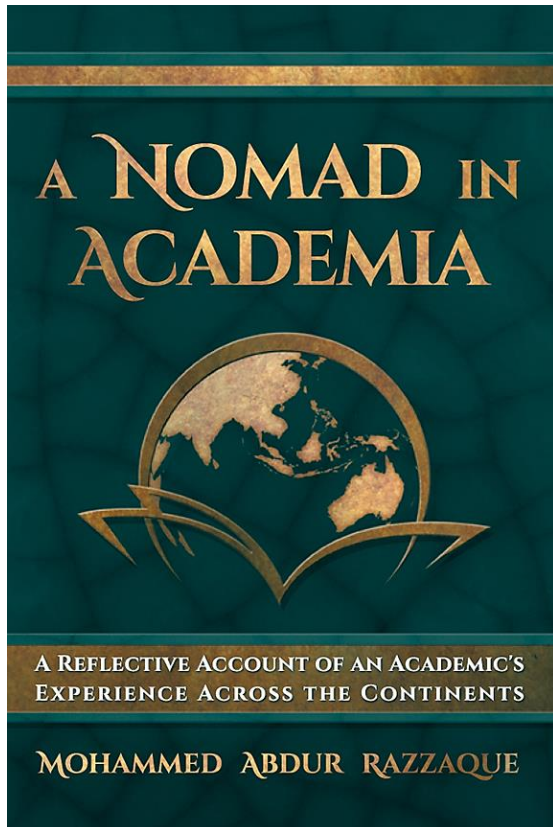


Culture Clash: Teacher's Autobiography Spans the Globe
